In 2021, the National CASA/GAL network, with its 97,920 volunteers, served more than 242,000 children who have experienced abuse and neglect.

In 2022, 1,239 CASA volunteers advocated for 3,538 abused and neglected children statewide. Kentucky currently has 22 local CASA programs that cover nearly 90 counties.
